From the Principal

Welcome back to Term 4.

It was wonderful to see the Year 12s this week and to have them back onsite. This is such an important time of year for them and so critical that they can be in classes with access to their teachers and to be with their friends. At this stage we await Government guidelines as to what the end of year celebrations can and will look like for our Year 12 students, obviously we hope to celebrate their graduation in an appropriate and safe manner.

We also look forward to the proposed staggered return of all year levels to onsite learning later this month and again strongly encourage families to consider having their sons and daughters vaccinated in readiness for the return.

Building

We are please to say that towards the end of this term we will be commencing some modernisation works on the McCartney and Corbett wings at the Edmund Rice site. As a means to ensuring the site is compliant for disability access and importantly to then be able to commence any other planned works, we will be installing new stairs and a lift in McCartney and a new entrance to the Corbett Wing. With all capital works comes some disruption to the day to day, however we hope to minimise this with much of the work taking place in the summer holidays.

Uniform

As we reimagine ourselves as St Mary's College we have determined to hasten slowly with any change to our uniform. We have been consistent in saying that we see any new uniform being a transition over a period of 2-3 years so as not to be a financial imposition on families. It continues to be acceptable for the CBC and PCW uniforms to be worn.

Commencing in 2022 we will start the phasing in of some new items for purchase when and if needed including the St Mary's College sports uniform and junior and senior St Mary's College ties.

We have entered into an arrangement with our uniform supplier Midfords for the changing over of blazer pockets to the St Mary's College design and will commence this later in the term and throughout next year.

Strategic Planning – Parent Survey

Our Strategic Planning process provides us with a clear sense of where we want to be in the short to medium term. Our plan will identify what we want to achieve in the next two to three years and how we plan to get there.

On each occasion over the past couple of years that students have first returned to school after a period of lockdown there has been a palpable sense of excitement and relief. A feeling that we can be normal again and that we are all so grateful to see each other and be back in a place that we feel so connected to. This was our experience at the Edmund Rice Campus on Tuesday, as we welcomed our Year 12 and accelerating students back to school to complete the General Achievement Test (GAT). Our senior students met with friends in a socially distanced setting and helped to calm each other's nerves before this 3 hour 15 minute examination. It was great to see them again, and a relief to function again in one small way for this group of students.

As we receive updated information from the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria (CECV) we continue to keep you informed of the changes to operations that impact upon the College community. One aspect of the planned easing of restrictions this term is our planning for the end of Year 12 classes and graduation events. At this stage, much of what is possible is unknown. However, I can confirm that Year 12 students will be farewelled with an online assembly next Thursday 14 October in Period 3, followed by an early dismissal and a celebration breakfast (once again, socially distanced) the next morning at the Presentation Campus.

I would also like to welcome back Year 7 - 11 students to online learning. I trust that you have all had a restful break spent close to home and are ready for the term ahead. Details of the end of lockdown place the return to school in sight. We can't wait to all be back at the College together when the circumstances permit.

As mentioned in my last newsletter article, I will be presenting one of the 11 EREA child safeguarding standards on this page each fortnight. The St Mary's College community are knitting squares to create blankets to donate to St Vinnies.

How can I help?

Knit a square! Often known as a tension square. It needs to be 10 x 10 cm.

These will then be sewn into blankets by volunteers and donated to members of our local community. Please measure the squares. It's just so much easier to join them if they are the correct size.

What materials should I use?

4.0 mm needles

8 ply wool

Cast on 22 stitches

Knit 30 rows

Where can my squares be dropped off?

Squares can be left at the St Mary's College reception. Either Presentation or Edmund Rice campus.

What size will the blankets be?

Large/Adult blankets to measure 140 x 180 cm.

Medium/Child blankets to measure 120 x 160 cm.

Small/Baby blankets to measure 100 x 120 cm.

Pathways

Year 12 students and their parents need to be aware of recent announcements by two major Universities, namely Melbourne and La Trobe, that any staff member or student attending campus next year will need to have proof of COVID-19 Vaccination.

This is hardly surprising, considering the difficulties that Universities and their students have faced over the last two years. There has been very little on-campus learning, constant change, interruptions, and the loss of the International Student cohort. I am sure these recent decisions are made with the best interests of students in mind and the hope of students being able to have a normal, enjoyable and effective learning experience.

It seems only logical to expect that most Universities will follow suit. TAFE/VET Institutes are also likely to introduce similar measures, since the practical requirements of VET Certificates and Diplomas are generally even higher than most university studies. I will keep parents of VCE and VCAL VET students informed of any developments, should such requirements be introduced for VET studies.

It is, of course, possible for students to defer most University (but not TAFE) courses for up to two years, so if a student has a difficulty with a vaccination policy, that might be an option for now. Another option is to sign up for an online course, although these will often have some requirements to attend campus from time to time.

There are many courses, both VET and University, that already require a range of vaccinations as a condition of enrolment. It is highly likely that COVID vaccination would be added. Students should check in VTAC Course Search for each course they have applied for, to see whether the *Enrolment Requirements* stipulate vaccinations. This would be relevant for most Degree and Diploma courses in Nursing, Paramedicine, Medicine and Allied Health. It is also worth checking education courses, as school staff must now be vaccinated, and school placements often take place quite early in the first semester. Students should carefully read any emails that VTAC might send them regarding their applications, in case there is further news about enrolment and attendance requirements.

For those joining the workforce soon or next year, especially apprentices, this should also serve as reminder that vaccination is mandatory for all workers in the Building Industry as well as those in a wide range of other essential employment.

Remember too, that all tertiary students will need a Tax File Number by the time they enrol in January, in order to be able to defer their fees through HECS-HELP, FEE-HELP or VET FEE-HELP.

Finally, a reminder students must complete all **SEAS** and **Scholarship applications**, including Supporting Statements and documentary evidence, by **5pm on Friday 8 October.**That is also the deadline for me to enter my SEAS Remote Learning Impact Rating in VTAC, so any student with information to add about their RL experiences, should email me by midday Friday.





Enrolments for 2022

Please note that we have commenced our planning for 2022 and confirming places for new students to start in Term 1, 2022. Unless we have already been advised, we are presuming that all current students will be returning to the College in 2022.

If a student is not returning to the College, in line with the enrolment policy, one term's notice in writing is required. If the notice is not received on time, one term's tuition fees in lieu of notice will be charged. This requirement is clearly noted in the General Terms & Conditions of Enrolment which forms part of the Application for Enrolment signed by all parents/guardians when their child(ren) was enrolled.

To assist our planning, please advise the College immediately, if a student is not returning to the College in 2022. The notice should be addressed to the College Registrar and can be sent via email to registrar@stmaryscollege.vic.edu.au It will be helpful to receive this notice as soon as possible as it will allow us to offer any vacant places to students on our waiting lists.

If there are siblings of current students wanting to enrol at the College, it is important that parents submit an Application for Enrolment two years prior to the planned year of entry. Siblings are not guaranteed a place if the Application for Admission is late.

Late applicants will be placed onto the waiting list.

Please do not hesitate to speak with the Registrar, Mrs Leah Mason, if you have any concerns regarding this information or if you need further clarification.

2021 Fee Accounts
