Year 7

Return on Friday October 22 and remain onsite full time.

Year 8 and 9

Onsite Tuesday - Wednesday commencing October 26. Learning remotely on all other days.

Year 10

Return on Friday October 22 and will be onsite part time for the following week. They will learn remotely Monday 25 to Wednesday 27 October before returning onsite on Thursday 28 and Friday 29 October.

Year 11

Return on Friday 22 October and remain onsite full time.

As previously communicated, it is a public health expectation that students wear a mask at all times when inside the classroom and outside, including on all public transport.



It is hard to believe that for a second year in a row our Year12 students are preparing for exams without the traditional rites of passage.

We all have different ways of preparing for exams; prayer and meditation might help. A good passage to meditate on before going into an exam is Psalm 121. It speaks of God's everlasting love, help and protection. Psalm 121 was sung by the ancient Israelites as they made their journey to Jerusalem. It was a treacherous journey for them as they scaled the hills around Jerusalem to get to religious festivals.

We all go through life needing to be held from time to time. Often, we turn to our parents or friends to advise and guide us. I frequently look upwards, *I lift up my eyes to the hills* in petition to God for a sign of which way to turn. *My help comes from the Lord.*Some may not always ask for it, but we understand that God is always there to help us. God watches over our lives from the beginning to the end. He wants to help us through life's trials and tribulations. *The Lord will keep you from all evil; he will keep your life.*

Pope Benedict XVI wrote that Psalm 121 .. draws to a close with a concise declaration of trust: God will protect us with love at every moment, guarding our lives from every evil. All our activities, summed up in two opposite verbs, "going" and "coming", always take place under the vigilant gaze of the Lord, as do all our acts and all our time, "both now and for ever".

Respectful Relationships 2022

Earlier this year, the College became a Respectful Relationships' Partner School. A key element of this is the Respectful Relationships Program where engaging and contemporary lessons are delivered to all students. Topics covered include: stress management; help-seeking behaviour; problem solving; safe socialising and gender and identity. The activities often involve scenarios and discussions and are tailored to be relevant to the various age groups in the school.

The College's Pastoral Team compiled Scope and Sequence Charts for all year-levels and mapped the program against the personal and social capabilities of the Victorian Curriculum. We are really looking forward to bringing this work to fruition next year during our fortnightly pastoral periods.

Mental Health Month

This month of October is mental health month. In keeping with this theme, last week Year 12 students listened to a presentation from Headspace in Elsternwick on "Managing Stress and Mental Health".

The three presenters covered a range of topics. Elaine Liebetrau reminded us how COVID has affected us (as if we needed to be reminded!). She spoke about our confusion over what we can and cannot do, increased stress, anger and frustration, increased anxiety, disappointment at missing milestones and holidays, irritability and low mood. She emphasised that all of these emotions are normal for these COVID times. She also spoke about mental wellness as a continuum, along which we move at various times, from "flourishing" to for some, "going through a tough time".

Bridie Mannion spoke about stress and how at its optimum, it is a good thing and very helpful for performing well. She spoke about ways to manage stress when it is not at its optimum. Some suggestions were to have a change of scene – go to a different room or get outside and have a break from the work desk. She encouraged us to move our bodies; do star jumps or stretches if we like. If we choose, we can journal and tell the pages how we feel or if not that, vent to a friend or loved one. We could practise yoga and meditation and make time to do something completely different to what we are doing.

The most important hint Bridie gave our students was a scientifically proven breathing technique, the 4-7-8 technique.

Breathe in for the count of 4

Hold the breath for the count of 7

Breathe out for the count of 8

This has been proven to lower the heart rate, feed information to our brain that we are not in danger and then help our body to relax.

Bridie also gave the students some exam techniques. Before the exam, be organised. Check that the calculator has batteries and that all equipment works. Students should eat a good light breakfast. Importantly they should spend some time on their own and keep away from people who are stressed. As we know, stress is contagious so keep well away!

Bridie also encouraged students to affirm themselves and encourage themselves like their best friend would. Finally, during the exam, students were encouraged to use their 4-7-8 method of breathing if too stressed.

The third speaker, Alex Young, as a Headspace Ambassador, spoke about how he managed his studies and kept a healthy headspace to perform well.

This was a very fitting presentation for our Year 12s as they embark on exams and transitioning from school to study and work.


Subject Allocations for 2022

Students should be receiving confirmation of their subject allocations for 2022 by the end of the first week in November. The timetable has been constructed using the preference data that the students entered into our system. As mentioned during our subject selection process, sometimes the choices are not possible because of the number of students choosing a subject and also a student may have chosen two subjects that are running at concurrently.

We will publish the lines (subject groupings) when the subject allocations are sent to the students, and they may request to change their allocations. A Request of Subject Change form will need to be completed and can be obtained from their Pastoral Leader.

All subject changes for VCE subjects must be **completed by the last day of Semester 2** and no other changes will be considered until the end of Semester 1 2022.




Year 9 vegetable garden






