

Last week Pope Francis visited Iraq, an historic trip marking the first ever papal visit to the country.

The aim of his pilgrimage was to stand in solidarity with long suffering Iraqi Christians. The Christian community grows smaller each year after decades of war and Islamic State. Today, they number less than 1% of the country's population. Christianity has been present in the Nineveh Plains, between Mosul and Iraqi Kurdistan, since the first century AD. During the four-day trip, Pope Francis called for peace and reconciliation for the Iraqi people and improved relations between Christians and Muslims.

The Pope visited Ur, which the Bible records as the birthplace of Abraham. Abraham is revered by Christians, Jews and Muslims alike. At this interreligious gathering Pope Francis said "Hostility, extremism and violence are not born of a religious heart; they are betrayals of religion". His hope is that religion can be part of the solution in the Middle East rather than part of the problem.

It was the Pope's first international trip since the start of the pandemic and it carried the motto from the Gospel of Matthew, *you are all brothers.* Matthew 23:8. This motto can be seen over the top of the logo for the trip. "You are all brothers and sisters", appears in three languages Arabic, Kurdish and Chaldean. Arabic is Iraq's official language, Sorani is spoken among the northern Kurdish minority, and Chaldean is spoken by Christians in the Nineveh Plains.

As we enter the fourth week of Lent, I wondered how we can all be brothers and sisters to those who challenge us? Those who make us feel uncomfortable? Those who are different to us? My hope is that as we encounter these people in our community, we can be part of the solution.

2021 Fee Accounts

All 2021 Fee Accounts are due and payable by **31 March 2021**, unless an approved Payment Plan is in place by this date.

Where a family pays the entire Family Fee Account balance prior to 31 March 2021 a \$350 Early Payment Discount will be credited to the Family Fee Account.

*Please note that the Early Payment Discount does not apply to Scholarship, Bursary and Fee Assistance Accounts.

Pay the entire Family Fee account balance prior to 31

March 2021

Eligible for **\$350** *Early Payment

Discount

Families making a full payment of Fees before 31 March 2021 may deduct the \$350 amount from the payment. Please note that in order to receive this discount the entire Family Fee Account balance for all students within the Family attending St Mary's College must be received into the St Mary's College bank account by 31 March 2021.

For the sake of clarity, deposits received in the St Mary's College bank account on 1
April 2021 will not be eligible to receive the Early Payment Discount.

Where Families elect to pay by instalments, a 2021 Fee Payment Agreement Form must be completed, signed and lodged with the Finance Office by **28 February 2021.**

All payment arrangements must be finalised by 31 October 2021.

Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund

2020 Applications are now Open

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Funding (CSEF) is a \$225 annual payment to schools that can be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of eligible students.

To qualify for the CSEF your family must satisfy the following criteria or be an eligible beneficiary of one of the following cards:

- Veterans Affairs Gold Card
- Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC)
- Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, or
- be a temporary foster parent, or
- the student is 16 years or older and holds a valid concession card (such as a Youth Allowance Health Care Card).

A special consideration eligibility category also exists.

The CSEF is paid directly to St Mary's College and will be credited against your Fee Account at St Mary's College to contribute towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.
