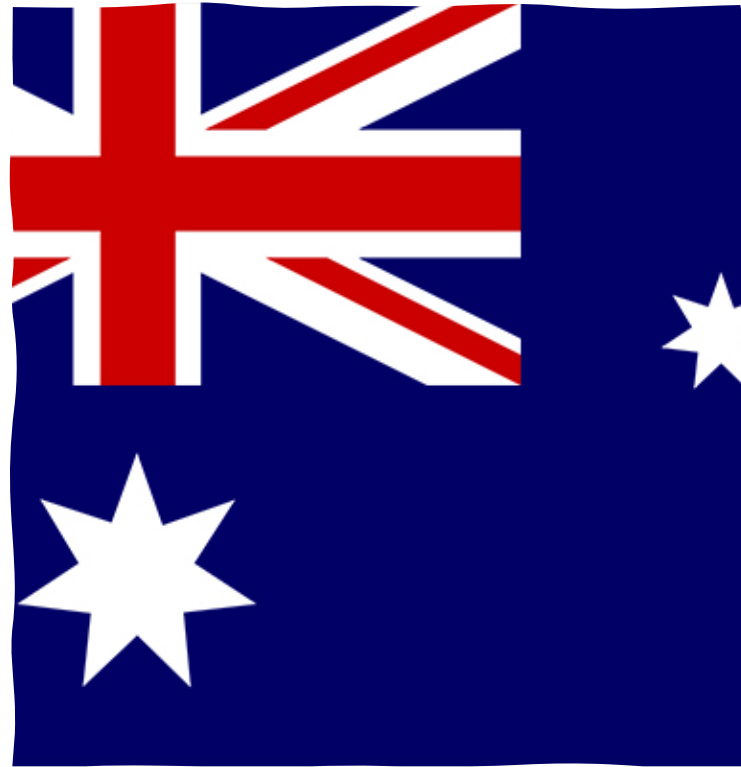

Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE)

Each VCE study (subject) is designed to provide a two-year program.

Units 1 and 2 can be completed as single units

Units 3 and 4 in each study must be completed as a sequence.

VCE minimum requirements

The minimum requirement is satisfactory completion of 16 units, Units 3 – 4 sequence which must include:

- three units from the English group, including a Unit 3–4 sequence
- at least three other sequences of Unit 3–4 studies, which can include further sequences from the English group.
- A minimum of 8 Units from a 3 – 4 sequence
- 80% attendance

VCE – Workload

- 3–4 hours of study per night
- Strategic use of time
- Homework – tasks to consolidate each day's learning
- Homestudy – revision time for each subject
- Consistency
- Study includes summary notes, concept maps, practice exam questions
- Subject teachers will help to guide students



VCE – Acceleration

Unit 3 and 4 study in Year 11

Criteria:

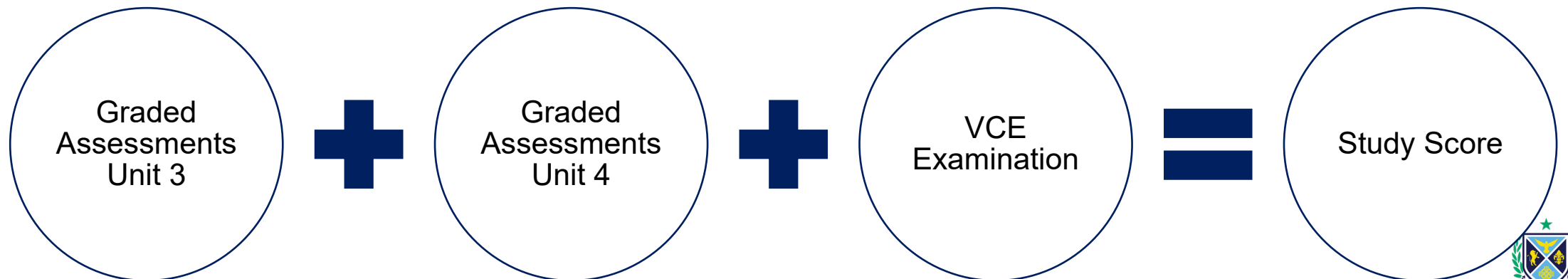
- Successful completion of a Unit 1 and 2 in Year 10
- No Unit 1 and 2 in Year 10 but meet the criteria:
 - Achieved A's in English
 - Achieved A's in at least two other subjects
 - High SPI
- Please consult the handbook
- Individual interview

VCE – Study Score (Unit 3 and 4)

A study score indicates how you have performed **in relation to all other students** who took the Units 3 and 4 study.

It is calculated using **statistically moderated** SACs and VCE exam results.

The weighting of each Graded Assessment depends on the study



VCE – ATAR

The ATAR is a rank based on each student's aggregate (or total) produced by adding:

- English study
- The next best three VTAC scaled study scores permissible
- 10% of the fifth and sixth permissible scores that are available



VCE – ATAR & Permissible scores

To ensure all students receive a well-rounded education in VCE, some Subject Areas have groupings.

At most, two results from the same study area grouping can be included in the primary four.

At most three results from the same study area grouping can contribute to the ATAR, the third being an increment.

Subject Area Groupings exist in:

- English, Mathematics, Music, History, Contemporary Society, Information Technology, Language and VET Industry Areas

- Numeracy
- Work Related Skills
- Personal Development Skills

- Selected VET study or VCE Elective
- Work placement

VET IN THE VCE and VCE VM



VET SUBJECTS

In both VCE and VCE VM, students may choose to study a VCE VET subject that **aligns with their interests.**

This may lead to a future career choice or just be an interest.

VCE VM students are able to undertake a School Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship (SBAT), as well as or, in some cases, instead of a VET Subject.

Graduates will receive an Industry recognised Certificate 2 or 3 in addition to their VCE.

How VET works

- **Vocational Education and Training = VET**
- A mix of theory and practical work
- Competency based assessment - *demonstrate* a skill, plus theory units
- *Training* more than teaching
- A **huge range** of interest areas
- Transferrable skills as well as specific employment skills – essential in current and future job market (e.g. creativity, problem-solving)
- Safe work practices
 - ✓ **Counts towards the ATAR for VCE**
 - ✓ **Compulsory for VCE VM students**



VET at St Mary's College



- External VET Programs are organised through the Inner Eastern VET Cluster as well as individual TAFE Institutes
- **Student travels to another venue** to do the VET Subject, usually on Wednesday afternoon (4- 6 hours per week), but some morning or all-day classes too.
- Structured Work Placement – usually 1 week per year but only compulsory for a few VET Subjects
- Only VCE VM students can do **all-day classes**
- ***Extra cost to families is involved*** – amount varies for each program – to be confirmed. Usually between \$800 and \$2000 dollars after subsidy.



VCE VET



A VET Study is **OPTIONAL** in VCE

- VCE VET Subject is taken **as one of the VCE Subject Choices**
 - “SCORED” provides a normal study score – students complete exam and coursework. This means VET Study can count in the best 4 like any other VCE subject
 - “UNSCORED” provides an increment – no exam, but 10% of the *lowest* of your best four. This is added as a 5th or 6th subject

A VCE VET Study is **COMPULSORY** in VCE Vocational Major

VET is a two-year program for VCE or VCE VM– it counts as:

- Units 1 & 2 (Year 11) – two or more units
- Units 3 & 4 (Year 12) – two or more units (Primary Study Score or 10% Increment)

SCHOOL BASED APPRENTICESHIP or TRAINEESHIP – VCE VM only

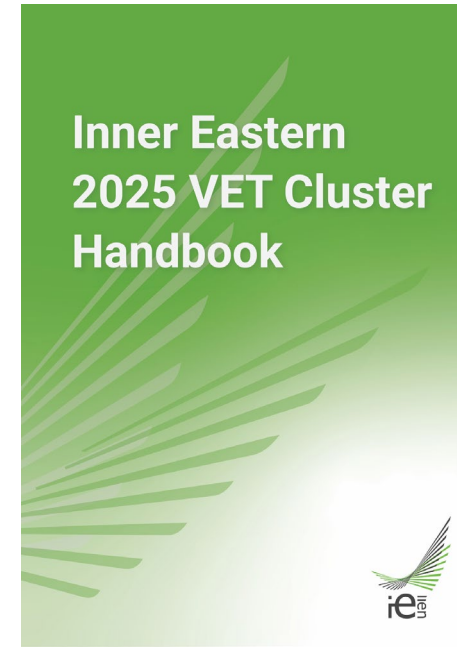

VET APPLICATION PROCESS CHECKLIST 2025

There are several steps involved in applying for a VET Subject. This Checklist should help. It is very important that the student and parent follow this process carefully and check that they have completed each step.

STEP	TASK	DONE
1	Apply for a USI – Unique Student Identifier at https://www.usi.gov.au/ EVERY VET or University student needs a USI to enrol in a course. It is a simple process. Record this safely here and in your phone too. <i>If you think you already have a USI, do not apply again! You can check on the website.</i>	
2	Check the VET Studies available in 2024 on the list St Mary's College List of VCE VET Studies 2025 St Mary's College List of VCE VET Studies 2025 . You should research the VET Studies that interest you – eg the Videos at GET VET	
3	Student and parent should carefully read the course descriptions and requirements in the various handbooks: Inner Eastern VET Cluster VET Handbook AFL Sports Ready VDSS and SBAT Guide Box Hill Institute Kangan Institute Melbourne Polytechnic William Angliss Institute VET Hospitality, Cookery & Tourism Victoria University – ask Mr Ellwood for a copy

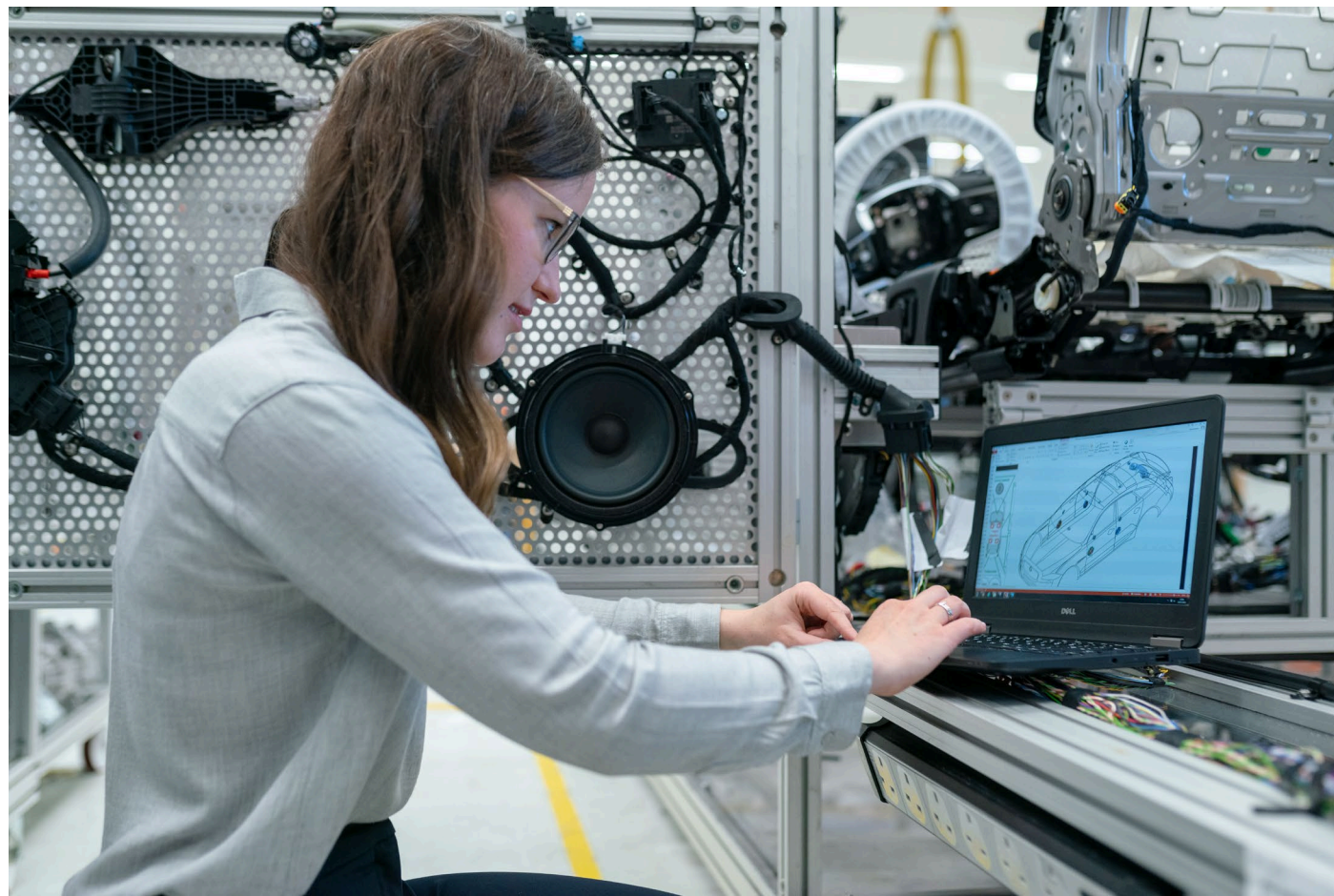

Formula for success

1. Choose subjects that really ***interest*** you – you cannot go wrong! (check your Morrisby Profile)

3. Lastly consider the subjects you might ***need*** or that might fit well with your other choices or have a relationship to a future career area – eg history as a background for Law, or psychology for Teaching

Many tertiary courses have specific

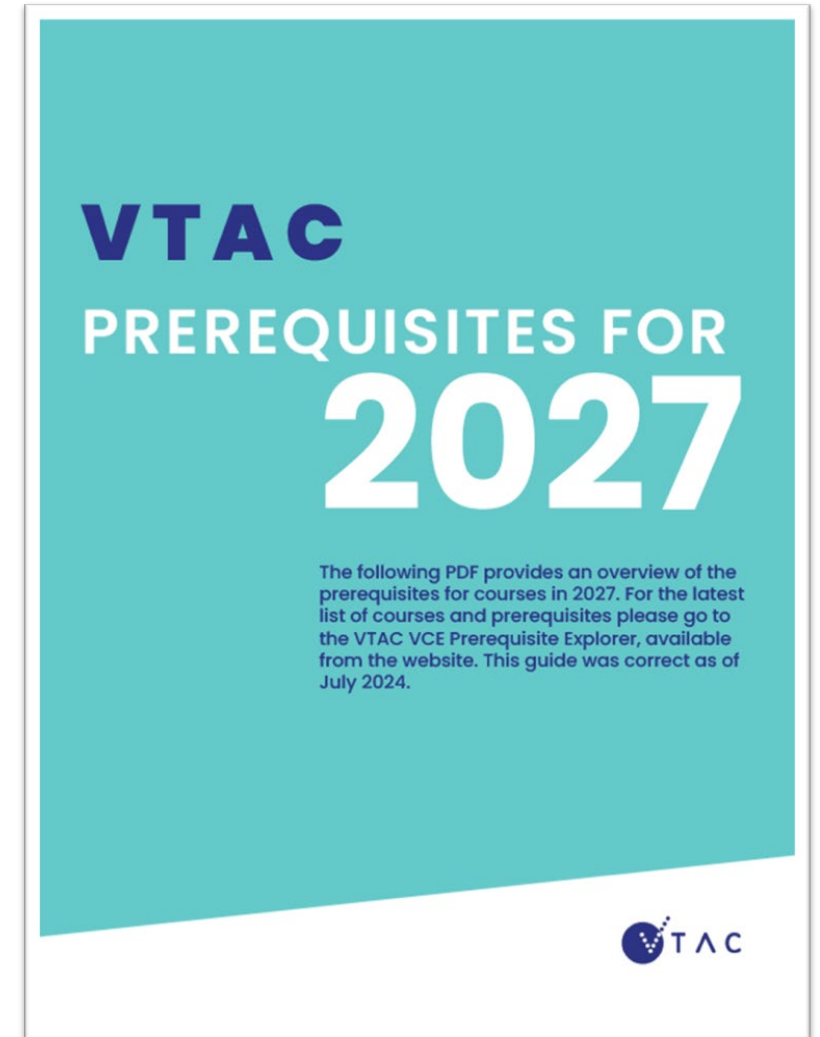
Prerequisite Studies:

- VCE Studies that are required in order to gain entry to a University course.
- These are set **3 years ahead**, so students can plan their VCE.

For example:

*“25 in Mathematical Methods” or
“30 in English” or just “English”*

More on Pre-requisite Subjects

- Many courses require only an English
- Some courses have no pre-requisites
- Some pre-requisites have a minimum score as well.
- The main concerns are:
 - Maths Methods, Chemistry, Physics.
 - Teaching and Nursing may need a Year 11 Maths.



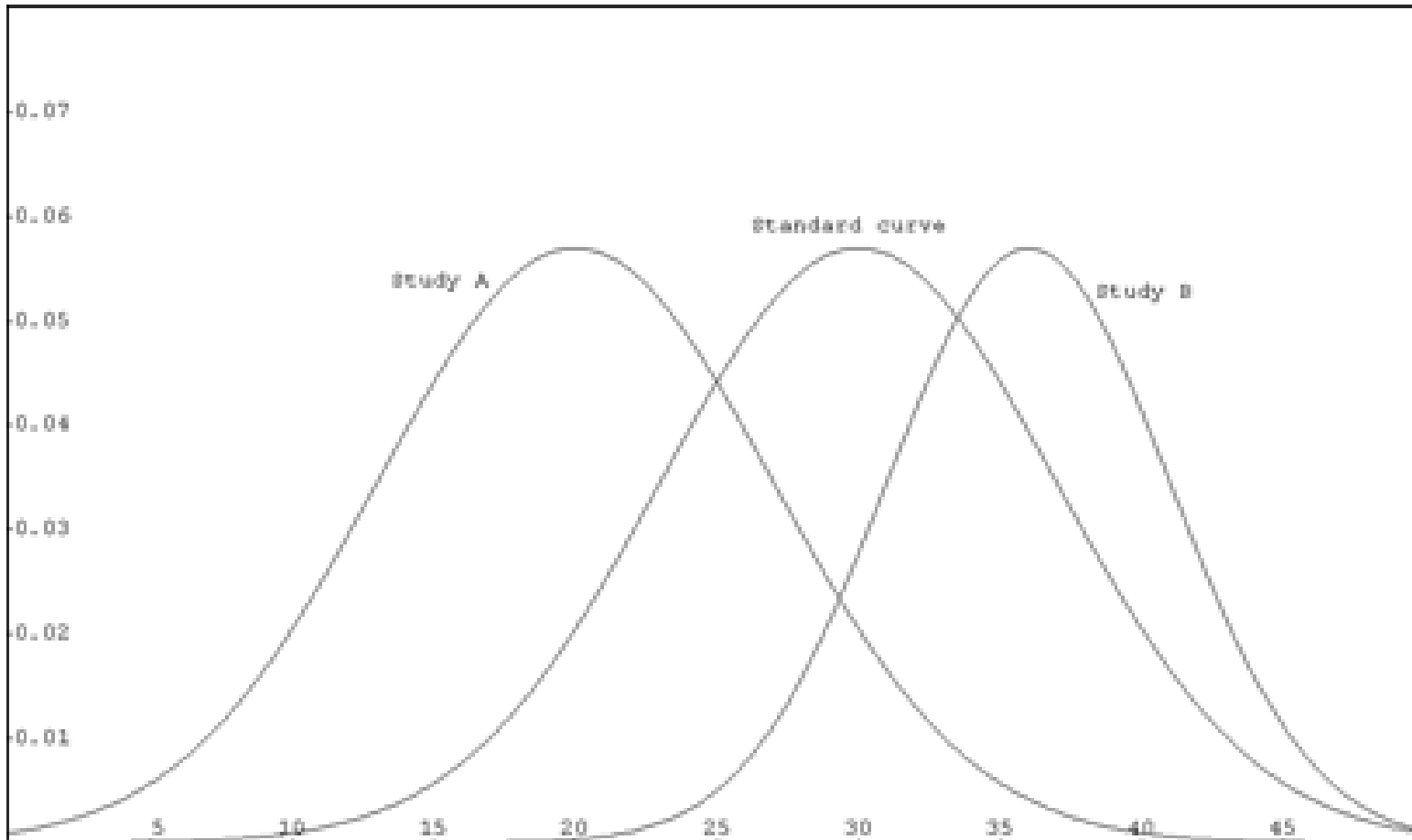
