Together, we have navigated the complex challenge of undertaking a significant building project on time and on budget, completed a major upgrade of our classroom technology, and vacated the Presentation Campus. While we worked assiduously to minimise the impact on classroom learning during the year, some disruption was inevitable, and my admiration goes out to our staff and young people who maintained focus during this time of great change. It was immediately apparent when we resumed in Term 4 that the school community was rejoicing in being together (once more) on the Edmund Rice Campus. While cohabitation presents its own mix of obstacles, it was our "better together" message that seemed to be the common sentiment being expressed and the potential for school spirit to flourish was undeniable.

VCE results ...

Congratulations to our College Dux, Adam Tran, and our graduating class of 2024. Jaeda Thornhill and Tyra Williams join Adam with ATARs over 90. An outstanding achievement. There are many 40+ study scores across a range of subject areas and we especially congratulate Tyra, and her teacher, Ms Halvatsis, on achieving 49 in Business Management. Our median ATAR is 63 and 25% of students achieved an ATAR over 70. Without diminishing the achievements of those seeking high ATARs, it's important to remember that success looks different for every young person. I would like to make special mention of 26 students who followed the Vocational Major (VM) pathway and, therefore, go unscored. Many of these young people are well advanced in moving into a full apprenticeship and the world of work and it is a delight to see each flourish. We are proud of the way all our young women and men have ended their secondary schooling at St Mary's this year. They showcased their maturity on the evening of the Graduation Dinner, where they displayed gratitude and kindness for the care they had received from their parents and their teachers.

On <u>Thursday, 30 Jan 2025</u>, the College welcomes all students from Years 7 – 12 for the start of the school year. Mobile Phone Policy

To create an environment conducive to learning with minimal distractions, we have a mobile phone policy in place. Students are not permitted to use their mobile phones during class time, phones must remain turned off and stored in lockers throughout the school day. If Parents/ Guardians need to contact their child, please do so via the school office.

Snack / Lunch

Students should bring a water bottle and snack / lunch on Welcome Day, according to the time their year-level will be attending school. Please note that the canteen will not be open on this day.

Locks

Locks went home with students on the last day of 2024. Students need to bring this lock to school for the start of 2025. If a lock has been lost the replacement cost is \$15. Year 7 students will be issued a lock.
